## **2009 Endless Mountains Digital Film Festival Winners Announced**

The winners of the 2009 Endless Mountains Digital Mountains Film Festival were announced on Sunday, June 14<sup>th</sup> at the Keystone Theatre in Towanda. Cody Sones and Jared Mcluhon of Hughesville won in the Teen/Adult category with their film, *"The Escape,"* a stop-action film in which the keyboard letters from a laptop join forces to save a recently-discarded mouse from the trash can. Noah Sunday-Lefkowitz of Shavertown won in the Under 12 category for his movie, *"The Amazing Animator."* This is Noah's second win in the festival having won in this category in 2007. The names of the winners have been engraved on the Festival Trophy exhibited in the lobby display case at the Keystone Theatre.

*"The Making of the Greatest Movie Ever"* by Kevin Davenport of Towanda won the Audience Choice Award at Sunday's Festival screening of the award-winning films. This is the third consecutive win for Kevin in this category. Other festival winners included: *"A Product of Love"* by Dillon Ameigh of Athens, *"Bear Shorts"* by John Moliski of Sayre, *"Beyond the Field"* by Philip Jampo of LeRaysville, *"Escape"* by Matt McGee of Muncy, *"Kyle's House"* by Zachary Matulevich of Hop Bottom, *"Night of the Slunk"* by Andrew Miller of Wyalusing, *"Operation"* by Brandt Snyder of Hughesville, *"The Truth About School Lunches"* by Rebeka Showers of Hughesville; *"A Love Supreme"* by Lyell Hintz of Bloomsburg; and *"Revenge of Galifray, Indiana Nugget 2"* by Alex Myers of Danville.
